



Post-Bacc DNP Adult-Gerontology Acute Care Nurse Practitioner Program

The Post-Bacc Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP) Adult-Gerontology Acute Care Nurse Practitioner (AGACNP) Program is based out of Newark, NJ. This program prepares students to provide direct patient care to adults with complex, acute illnesses in collaboration with other members of the health care team. Graduates will be eligible for certification through the American Nurses Credentialing Association as an Adult-Gerontology Acute Care Nurse Practitioner in the state of NJ. The program is designed for either part time or full time study. You must have a minimum of 2 years acute care experience.

Role and qualifications: The acute care nurse practitioner (ACNP) is educationally prepared to provide advanced nursing care to patients with complex acute, critical and chronic health conditions, including the delivery of acute care services. By virtue of the practice setting and patient acuity levels, the acute care nurse practitioner performs diagnostic and therapeutic interventions to manage acute and critical health problems. This includes the ordering, performing, interpreting and supervising interventions and diagnostic strategies to promote stability and health during the acute or chronic critical illness.

Scope of Practice: The ACNP will also be expected to construct a plan of care that is congruent with the cultural and spiritual needs of the patient, in the context of the community. The curriculum focuses on adults with complex, acute and chronic illnesses whom are cared for in acute care institutions: critical care, emergency departments, trauma units, or specialty practices. Each course is built upon prior knowledge, so it is important to follow the recommended sequence of courses. The track emphasizes critical thinking, case analysis and problem solving, and the research process in collaboration with other health care

Curriculum: The Post-Bacc DNP Adult-Geriatric Acute Care Nurse Practitioner Program is 71 credits with 540 clinical hours devoted to precepted NP practice and 500 mentored hours in which the student develops, implements, evaluates, and disseminates their DNP project.
