Post-Master's Certificate Program Family Nurse Practitioner

The Post-Master's Certificate as a Family Nurse Practitioner includes the following required courses. A minimum of 30 credits and 675 clinical hours must be successfully completed to obtain a PMC in FNP and be eligible to sit for national certification as an AGPC nurse practitioner.

Theory and Practicum courses are co-requisites and must be taken together. Both courses must be successfully completed in the same semester in order to progress to the next course.

NOTE: Nine (9) credit hours in Advanced Pathophysiology, Advanced Pharmacology, and Advanced Health Assessment are needed prior to admittance into the program. Pharmacology credits must be within 5 years of state APN certification. If older than 5 years, the course may be repeated or continuing pharmacology education hours will need to be obtained.
