Post-Master's Certificate Program Family Nurse Practitioner in Emergency Care

The Post Master's Certificate (PMC) in Family in Emergency Care is designed for Adult or Family Nurse Practitioners. A minimum of 24 credits must be successfully completed to obtain a PMC in FNP in Emergency Care and be eligible to apply for national certification. Adult NPs must complete Family Centered Primary Care for Infants/Children/Adolescents Theory and Practicum. A total of 675 clinical hours must be successfully completed to be eligible to sit for the Family Nurse Practitioner certification examination.

**Family Health Nurse Practitioners do not have to take Family Centered Prim. Care. Two elective courses will be taken in their place

Theory and Practicum courses are co-requisites and must be taken together. Both courses must be successfully completed in the same semester in order to progress to the next course.

NOTE: Nine (9) credit hours in Advanced Pathophysiology, Advanced Pharmacology, and Advanced Health Assessment are needed prior to admittance into the program. Pharmacology credits must be within 5 years of state APN certification. If older than 5 years, the course may be repeated or continuing pharmacology education hours will need to be obtained.
