We are pleased to learn you are considering serving as a clinical preceptor for one of our RN to BS in Nursing students. The following material provides general information about the School of Nursing, the RN to BS in Nursing Program, and role and responsibilities of the faculty and preceptor pertaining to student preceptorship and evaluation.

As you may be aware, the Board of Nursing has adopted new regulations requiring continuing education for all nurses in the state of New Jersey. In accordance with N.J.A.C. 134:37-5.3 Continuing Education, *a registered professional nurse may obtain continuing education hours for acting as a preceptor for at least 100 hours as part of an organized preceptorship program: 10 hours for the period during which the registered professional nurse acts as a preceptor.* Should you agree to serve as a preceptor, documentation of your service and contact hours will be provided after the student completes the course.

Please feel free to contact us if you have questions. The School of Nursing values your services as a possible preceptor. We hope you will find the materials to follow helpful in deciding to serve as a student clinical preceptor. If you decide to participate, you will be asked to submit a copy of your resume with the required forms and signatures (provided to you by the student).
