

Nursing Education MSN Program

Curriculum effective Fall 2013.

The MSN in Education prepares educators who will have expertise in advanced clinical care, education, and evidence based approaches to education and care.

Role and Qualifications: The program prepares students for roles as teacher, scholar and collaborator. Graduates of the Rutgers MSN in Education track who apply for and are admitted to the DNP program will have completed 6 credits (NURS 5610: Information Technology & Evidence-Based Practice; and, NURS 6200: Advanced Health Promotion Across Diverse Cultures) toward the completion of DNP course requirements.

Curriculum: This 40-credit program can be completed in part-time or full –time study. The following are the required courses for this specialty.
