Post-Bacc DNP Adult-Gerontology Primary Care Nurse Practitioner Program

The Post-Baccalaureate Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP) Adult-Gerontology Primary Care Nurse Practitioner (AGPCNP) program is based at the Rutgers Biomedical Health Sciences Campus in Newark, NJ. This program of study prepares nurses to assume the role of primary care provider for patients from adolescence through the frail elderly. The curriculum provides a combination of theory and practicum experiences. The School of Nursing offers students the opportunity to learn from experienced and nationally recognized faculty who all are actively engaged in teaching and clinical practice. Students receive mentoring and individualized attention from faculty throughout the program based on the student's needs.

Role and Qualifications: An AGPCNP has a graduate degree in Nursing and advanced preparation in the evaluation and management of changing health needs in adolescents and adults. Our AGPCNP graduate is distinguished by doctoral preparation that supports advanced clinical practice and leadership in nursing. Upon successful completion of the program, graduates are eligible for the Adult-Gerontology Primary Care Nurse Practitioner certification exam given by the American Nurses' Credentialing Center (ANCC) or the American Academy of Nurse Practitioners (AANP). Once nationally certified, graduates can apply for certification in the State of New Jersey as advanced practice nurses with prescriptive authority.

Scope of Practice: The AGPCNP provides a holistic approach to primary care for patients across the lifespan from adolescence to senescence in diverse practice and health care settings. The AGPCNP emphasizes health promotion and preventive care utilizing evidenced based practice and interprofessional collaboration with attention to vulnerable populations.

Curriculum: The Post-Bacc DNP Adult-Gerontology Primary Care Nurse Practitioner Program is 68 credits with 540 clinical hours devoted to precepted NP practice and 500 mentored hours in which the student develops, implements, evaluates, and disseminates their DNP project. The program can be completed through part-time or full-time study. The following are the required courses for this program.
