The minimum number of combined clinical practicum and DNP project experience hours is 1000. Many students, however, may be required to complete more than 1000 hours to meet minimum competency requirements for graduation and certification (when applicable).

Students unable to complete the DNP Project courses may be offered an In-Progress (IP) grade. Please note, the outstanding coursework must be completed and the grade replaced with the grade earned within 12 months (regardless of enrollment status). Students who have not completed the DNP Project Course requirements (those who have an IP grade) will be required to register for a one credit "Project Continuation" course each semester until the course grade is changed and the student is able to progress in the program or complete the project (see timelines outlined below). MS to DNP programs must be completed in their entirety within five (5) years of admission. Please refer to the Division of Advanced Nursing Practice for more details surrounding information about the DNP Project courses, progression, and program completion timelines.
