



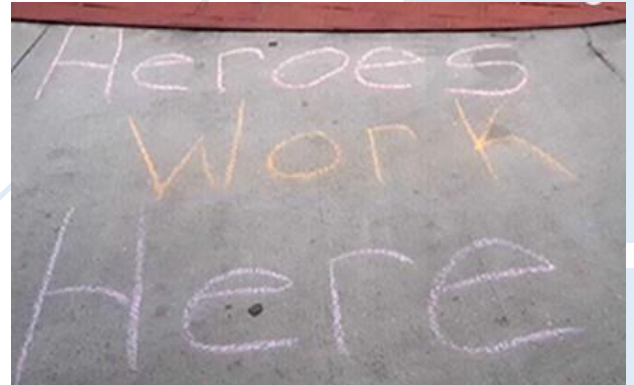
Registered Nurse Residency Program

Cooperman Barnabas Medical Center is offering The Registered Nurse Residency Program for the newly licensed nursing graduate with less than one year of experience.

This one year long program consists of nursing orientation and clinical orientation followed by monthly sessions geared to mold and support the new graduate nurse to fully transition to practice.

Topics include: Time Management, Resiliency, Quality and Safety, Diversity and Inclusion, Delegation, Evidence-Based Practice, and Being a Change Agent to list a few.

Participants are engaged through journaling, simulation, group projects, mentorship, shadowing experiences and more.



Application requirements for participation include:

- Graduated from a nursing program accredited by the National League for Nursing Accrediting Commission (NLNAC) or the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE)
- Possession of an active unencumbered Registered Nurse (RN) license in the State of New Jersey
- Possession of American Heart Association Basic Life Support for Healthcare Providers Certification
- Less than 12 months experience as a Registered Nurse in an acute care setting
- Hired as a Full Time Registered Nurse
