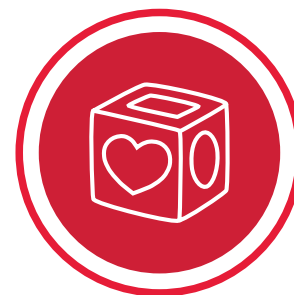




Curriculum effective Fall 2021
