Post-Baccalaureate DNP Nurse-Midwifery Program

The Post-Baccalaureate Doctor of Nursing (DNP) Nurse-Midwifery Program is based at the Rutgers Biomedical and Health Sciences Campus in Newark, NJ. The Nurse-Midwifery DNP Program provides students with advanced preparation in the assessment and management of women's health issues. Certified Midwifery Practitioners manage the primary, obstetric, and gynecologic care of essentially healthy women across the life span as well as healthy newborns in a variety of settings. Graduates are eligible to take the nurse-midwifery certification exam, which is administered by the American Midwifery Certification Board (AMCB). The program can be completed in either part-time or full-time study.

The DNP in Nurse-Midwifery prepares graduates to be practice leaders at the highest level in the application and translation of evidence-based research to improve health systems and health care for women. The DNP emphasizes advanced leadership and expertise to challenge the standards of practice and create innovative models of care.

The program course load is 81 credits with 810 precepted practicum hours. The program can be completed in either part-time or full-time study. The following are the required courses:
