Post-Baccalaureate DNP Leadership Program

The Post-Baccalaureate Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP) Leadership program is designed for those on a leadership trajectory across all settings. This program is designed to incorporate the ongoing changes in the healthcare system. The Essentials of the Doctoral Education for Advanced Nursing Practice, Quality and Safety in Education for Nurses (QSEN) and the American Organization of Nurse Executives (AONE) competencies are embedded in this program. Students completing this program are prepared to take the leadership certification exam offered through the American Nurses Credentialing Center (ANCC) or AONE. Specialty courses are offered in a hybrid model. Other courses are offered in the following models: inperson, hybrid, and remote.



Role and Qualifications: Students in this program come from varied roles ranging from staff nurse-to-nurse executive, and across varied settings to include practice, academia, and industry.

Scope of Practice: Graduates of this program are expected to lead healthcare organizations across the continuum in changing the delivery of care and the expected outcomes for our clients, community, and global health. Graduates of this program will contribute to the discipline of nursing through innovation and evidence.

Curriculum: The Post-Baccalaureate DNP Leadership Program is 60 credits with a minimum of 680 precepted practicum hours. This is when the student develops, implements, evaluates, and disseminates their DNP Project. Applications are accepted in both Fall and Spring semesters on a rolling basis. ^{**}The minimum number of combined clinical practicum and DNP project experience hours is 1000. Students, however, may be required to complete more than 1000 hours to meet minimum competency requirements for graduation and certification (when applicable).
