Post-Baccalaureate DNP Dual Nurse-Midwifery/ Women's Health Nurse Practitioner Program

The Post-Baccalaureate Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP) Dual Nurse-Midwifery/Women's Health Nurse Practitioner Program is based at the Rutgers Health Campus in Newark, NJ. This program of study prepares students to be independent providers of full-scope health care across the lifespan including primary care; sexual, reproductive, and gynecologic health care; care during pregnancy, labor and birth, and the postpartum period; and care for the healthy neonate. The dual nurse-midwifery/women's health curriculum provides a combination of theory and practicum experiences. The School of Nursing offers students the opportunity to learn from experienced and nationally recognized faculty who are all actively engaged in teaching and clinical practice.

Role and Qualifications: A doctorally-prepared (DNP) nurse-midwife/women's health nurse practitioner has a graduate degree in nursing and is prepared to provide clinical care aligned with the midwifery model of care for diverse individuals, families, and communities and contribute to interprofessional collaboration. The nurse-midwife/women's health nurse practitioner graduate is distinguished by doctoral preparation that supports both clinical practice and leadership in nursing. Upon successful completion of the program, graduates will have met Core Competencies as outlined by the American College of Nurse-Midwives and Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education and be eligible for both the American Midwifery Certification Board (AMCB) midwifery certification examination and the National Certification Corporation (NCC) Women's Health Care Nurse Practitioner certification examination.

Scope of Practice: Program graduates will have expertise in both nurse-midwifery and women's health advanced practice nursing. As practiced by certified nurse-midwives, midwifery encompasses a full range of primary health care services for women from adolescence beyond menopause. These services include the independent provision of primary care, sexual and reproductive healthcare, including family planning services, preconception care, prenatal care, childbirth and the postpartum period, and care of the normal newborn during the first 28 days of life. As advanced practice registered nurses, women's health nurse practitioners are prepared to address women's complex gynecologic, sexual, reproductive, obstetric, and primary health care needs throughout the lifespan. WHNPs also provide sexual and reproductive healthcare for men.

Curriculum: This program is 80 credits with 1080 precepted practicum hours and can be completed through a part-time (4 years) plan of study. The following are the required courses for this program:
