- 1. **Policy Statement:** To provide the resident registered nurse anesthetist with the opportunity to obtain clinical experiences outside the regular clinical schedule, develop skills and judgment required to manage emergency anesthetics, and obtain clinical experiences required for eligibility to sit for the National Certification Examination for Nurse Anesthetists.

## 4. Policy

All students will be assigned to clinical experiences that include "in house call" when deemed appropriate by the Program Director and/or Assistant Program Director. They will provide experiences that may include: anesthesia services for emergency surgery, trauma resuscitation and surgery, and emergency airway management for critically ill patients. At all times during this experience the clinical performance of the resident registered nurse anesthetist will be closely mentored and appropriately directed by a CRNA and/or anesthesiologist with appropriate credentials and clinical experience. This experience will include nontraditional hours (evenings, nights and holidays) and assignments of longer duration. Student clinical assignments will not exceed sixteen hours, and will be subject to the limitations described in the program policy: CLINICAL ATTENDANCE.
