4. Policy

All students are required to take the Self-Evaluation Examination (SEE), administered by the Council on Certification of Nurse Anesthetists, a minimum of two times during the course of study, as detailed in course syllabi and requirements. It is intended as an individual self-assessment tool for the student in preparation for the National Certification Examination during the first two years in the program. During the final year, the student must pass with a minimum score prescribed in the Clinical Residency syllabi in order to receive a passing grade in the final anesthesia practicum course. The examination will also be used compositely as an outcome indicator for the program. The student is responsible for the expense of each SEE examination and for completing the examinations within the time frame prescribed by the Program Director.
