## Post-Baccalaureate DNP Adult-Gerontology Acute Care Nurse Practitioner Program



The Post-Baccalaureate Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP) Adult-Gerontology Acute Care Nurse Practitioner (AGACNP) Program is based out of Newark, NJ. This program prepares students to provide direct patient care to adults with complex, acute illnesses in collaboration with other members of the health care team.

Graduates will be eligible for certification through the American Nurses Credentialing Association (ANCC) as an Adult-Gerontology Acute Care Nurse Practitioner in the state of New Jersey. Applicants must have a minimum of 2 years of acute care experience.

**Role and Qualifications:** The acute care nurse practitioner (ACNP) is educationally prepared to provide advanced nursing care in acute care settings to patients with complex acute, critical, and chronic health conditions. By virtue of the practice setting and patient acuity levels, the acute care nurse practitioner performs diagnostic and therapeutic interventions to manage acute and critical health problems. This includes the ordering, performing, interpreting, and supervising of interventions and diagnostic strategies to promote stability and health during the acute or chronic critical illness.

**Scope of Practice:** The ACNP will also be expected to construct a plan of care that is congruent with the cultural and spiritual needs of the patient. The curriculum focuses on adults with complex, acute, and chronic illnesses cared for in acute care institutions: hospital settings including critical care, emergency departments, trauma units, or specialty practices. Each course is built upon prior knowledge, so it is important to follow the recommended sequence of courses. The track emphasizes critical thinking, case analysis and problem solving, and the research process in collaboration with other health care team members.

**Curriculum:** The Post-Baccalaureate DNP Adult-Gerontology Acute Care Nurse Practitioner Program is 75 credits with 752 precepted practicum hours. The following are the required courses for this program:
