Masters in Nursing Leadership Program

The Masters in Nursing Leadership Program builds upon the foundation of baccalaureate education. This program is designed to incorporate the ongoing changes in the healthcare system. The Essentials of the Master's Education in Nursing (AACN), Quality and Safety in Education for Nurses (QSEN), and the American Organization for Nursing Leadership (AONL) competencies are embedded in this program. Students completing this program are prepared to take the leadership certification exam offered through the American Nurses Credentialing Center (ANCC) or AONL. This programs offers a blend of synchronous and asynchronous remote courses. The practicum courses are assigned and require 500 hours of mentored practicum experience by program completion.



Role and Qualifications: Students in this program come from varied roles ranging from staff nurse-to-nurse executive, and across varied settings to include practice, academia, and industry. Students develop the skills and knowledge needed to evolve the healthcare system.

Scope of Practice: Graduates with a master's degree in nursing are prepared for new and innovative roles across the continuum. This program is designed so graduates who would like to pursue a Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP) can progress seamlessly without repeating courses already completed in this master's program. Applications are accepted in both Fall and Spring semesters on a rolling basis.

Curriculum: The Masters in Leadership Program is 42 credits with minimum 510 mentored hours required. These practicum hours are integrated in both theory and practicum courses. The following are the required courses for this program:
