Post-Master's DNP Nursing Leadership Program

The Post-Master's Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP) Nursing Leadership program is designed for nurses on a leadership trajectory across all settings. This program incorporates the ongoing changes in the healthcare system. The Essentials of the Doctoral Education for Advanced Nursing Practice (AACN), Quality and Safety Education for Nurses (QSEN) and the American Organization for Nursing Leadership (AONL) competencies are embedded across the program. Graduates are prepared to take the leadership certification exam offered through the American Nurses Credentialing Center (ANCC) or AONL. The target population for this program are masters-prepared nurses who aim to attain the highest levels of excellence. The Program is designed to accommodate full-time practice. Students meet for two remote weekend classes per semester. Classes are asynchronous over a 15 week semester. Class times for weekend courses vary by course. Additional individual or class meetings will be determined by course faculty. The weekend schedule for the whole program is released upon admission. The following are the required courses for this program:



Role and Qualifications: Students in this program come from varied roles ranging from staff nurse to nurse executive and across varied settings to include practice, academia, and industry.

Scope of Practice: Graduates will contribute to the discipline of nursing through innovation and evidence, lead healthcare organizations across the continuum, and change the delivery of care and expected outcomes for our clients, community, and global health.

Curriculum: The Post-Masters DNP Leadership Program is 42 credits. Applications are accepted in both Fall and Spring semesters on a rolling basis. The following are the required courses for this program:DNP Core Courses:
