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1. Policy Statement

This policy describes the academic conditions that are considered unsatisfactory and jeopardize a student's scholastic standing at Rutgers School of Nursing. Unsatisfactory academic performance may result in probation or dismissal.

2. Reasons for Policy

To provide an overview of the midterm warning, course withdrawal, academic probation, academic suspension, academic dismissal, and the academic dismissal appeals processes.

3. Who Should Review This Policy

All Rutgers School of Nursing undergraduate students, faculty, and administration.

5. **Definitions**

- Nursing Prerequisite: A required course that must be taken before the 300-level or higher nursing coursework.
- Term GPA refers to a student's semester GPA for the active semester (fall, spring, summer).
- **Cumulative GPA** refers to a student's overall GPA for all coursework completed at Rutgers University.
- Academic Warning: A student will receive an academic warning if they are not meeting the
 academic progress or GPA requirements to remain in good standing. An academic warning is an
 informal and a strong recommendation to the student to work with their academic advisor, EOF
 counselor (if applicable), or Program Director on a plan to improve grades.
- Academic Probation: Academic probation is a status that indicates that a student's performance has
 fallen below the School's requirement for good academic standing. As a condition of probation,
 students are given a timeframe by which they are expected to improve their grades to avoid
 dismissal. While academic probation is not meant to be punitive, it should be taken seriously as it is
 an official acknowledgment that the student is in jeopardy of being dismissed.

- Academic Dismissal: Academic dismissal is when a student is asked to leave the School because of
 poor academic or clinical performance, or due to an infraction of a policy such as a code of conduct
 or academic integrity policy.
- **Suspension:** Suspension is when a student is forbidden from attending classes for a specific period of time due to a serious infraction of a policy such as a code of conduct or academic integrity policy.

6. The Policy: Traditional Program

During a student's matriculation in the Nursing program at the end of every semester (fall, spring, summer) a progression (academic standing) review will be completed.

<u>Progression review for the first initial fall semester, will not result in dismissal for any academic deficiencies.</u> However, those grades will be counted towards future progression review for the remainder of a student's matriculation.

Reviews of academic deficiency occur under **four (4)** categories: non-nursing coursework (see Table below), Nursing (705) coursework, cumulative GPA, and course attempts as defined below.

Nursing prerequisites are listed in the current traditional program academic <u>curriculum</u> in the table below. Required passing grade to be considered complete is a C (2.0). These courses must be completed prior to progressing into clinical level coursework (300-level).

Nursing (705) Coursework: Defined as subject codes of 25:705 and 77:705. A full listing of courses can be found in the current academic <u>curriculum</u> Required passing grade to be considered complete is a C+ (2.5).

Nursing courses (ALL courses with 705 subject code)	C+ or higher (2.5)
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Term and/or Cumulative GPA: The required GPA for program completion and academic good standing (term and cumulative GPA) is defined as a 2.00 minimum. Term GPA refers to a student's semester GPA for the active semester (fall, spring, summer). Cumulative GPA refers to a student's overall GPA for all coursework completed at Rutgers University.

Course Attempts: Students will have a maximum of three (3) attempts for an individual course. They can receive no more than one (1) failed grade, two (2) withdrawals, and must complete the course with a performance grade (numeric grade) by the final third (3rd) attempt.

Failure to successfully complete course(s) in the first or repeated (2nd) attempt can result in delay of progression and program completion.

Note: Nursing (705) 200-level coursework can be withdrawn individually. Withdrawal from all nursing courses (300 and 400 level) in a given semester is considered a single withdrawal.

Academic Warning		
Academic deficiency:

Note: It is the student's responsibility to notify their corresponding advisor of any changes to course registration that can affect program sequence such as course withdrawal and/or registration that does not follow the recommended nursing curriculum.

Consequence:

Students will receive informal notification or "Academic Warning" and will need to meet with their corresponding advisor (academic advisor, EOF counselor, Program Director) to discuss potential impact on academic progression.

Consequence: Student will receive official notification of Academic Probation via an academic memo sent to their registered Rutgers email. The student will meet with their corresponding advisor (academic advisor, EOF counselor, Program Director) to discuss resources to remediate the academic deficiency and confirm if timely academic progression is possible.

Note: A student not following progression sequence is subject to delay of progression into clinical coursework, graduation, timing out of program completion, or academic dismissal from the nursing program.

Consequence: Student will receive official notification of Academic Dismissal via an academic memo sent to registered Rutgers email. The student will be provided one (1) transition semester, during the subsequent academic semester (fall or spring), to complete an internal transfer to another academic program to remain active at Rutgers University. The student will meet with their corresponding advisor (academic advisor, EOF counselor, Program Director) to discuss resources available.

Academic Suspension

Violation of school or university policies, such as the Academic Integrity Policy, the University Code of Student Conduct, or the School of Nursing Standards of Conduct (violations are specified in the policies) may result in dismissal.
